The magazine will come out every 2 months.


Any short stories, pictures, poems etc. are most welcome and should be sent in to the Editor.

Many surveys were made and lots of companies started but no actual work was ever done till in 1879 Ferdinand de Lesseps and his company started work but failed because the money was spent badly, fever set in and he tried to make a sea level canal.

It was not until 1893 that another company started. This company succeeded in building the canal which is there today, it took 14 years to build. William C. Gorgas made all workers total abstainers and took measures against the fever carrying mosquitos — thus helping greatly.






Everyone gasped in surprise. Suddenly Mrs. But stooped down and snatched up the coat which had fallen to the ground when the door opened.

A Small, Untidy Room

Favourite Recipes.

Pink Lady Cake.

$\frac{1}{4}$ lb butter	1 teacup sugar
$\frac{1}{4}$ lb cocoanut	2 eggs
6 oz. flour	$\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk
1 teaspoon baking powder	$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon cochineal

Cream butter and sugar, (d) add eggs, cocoanut and flour. Baking powder to be added last of all.

Bake in a moderate oven for about $\frac{3}{4}$ of an hour.

Put pink or orang icing on top and perhaps some butter icing in the middle too.
